

TOWNSHIP OF ADMASTON/BROMLEY

Public Planning Meeting

Council held a public planning meeting at the Municipal Council Chambers on Thursday, June 16, 2016 at 7:15 p.m. Council members present were Mayor Michael Donohue, Deputy Mayor Robert Dick, Councillors Bob Hall, Kevin LeGris and Mike Quilty. Staff member present was Clerk-Treasurer Annette Louis. Members of the public present were Murray Reid and Ray Pender.

Mayor Donohue called the public planning meeting to order.

Mayor Donohue reported that the public planning meeting was being held to consider a Zoning By-Law Amendment requested by Murray Reid.

Consent application B18/16 was submitted to the County of Renfrew for a lot addition to be added to the abutting Admaston Protestant Cemetery. The rezoning is a condition to the granting of severance.

The purpose of the amendment is to rezone approximately 3552 square meters of vacant land, which are the severed lands in consent application of B18/16 that are to be added to the abutting Admaston Protestant Cemetery. The additional lands are to be used only for parking for the cemetery.

The lands affected by the amendment are known as Part of the east half of Lot 12, Concession 4, in the geographic Township of Admaston.

The effect of the amendment is to rezone the subject lands from Agriculture (A) to Community Facility Exception One (CF-E1). All other provisions of the Zoning By-law shall apply.

The Clerk reported that Notice of the public meeting was mailed to eight property owners of land within 120 metres of the land affected by the zoning amendment on May 24, 2016.

Notice was also sent to the:

- Owners
- to six public bodies as required
- County of Renfrew Director of Public Works & Engineering
- County of Renfrew C.A.O./Clerk.

Two written comments were received providing the following comments:

Enbridge Gas Distribution does not object to the proposed application(s). Enbridge Gas Distribution reserves the right to amend or remove development conditions.

The County of Renfrew Public Works and Engineering Department has reviewed the information provided for the Zoning By-Law Amendment application and we have no comments or concerns.

Seeing no other comments or inquiries from the Public, the Applicant or Council, Mayor Donohue called a brief recess at 7:20 p.m.

Mayor Donohue called the meeting back into session at 7:29 p.m. and provided an explanation on the appeal process.

Hearing no concerns or objections the Thursday June 16th 2016 Public Planning meeting was adjourned at 7:30 p.m.
